Vehicle registrations fees due on or after January 1, 2018, will increase due to the new transportation improvement fee (TIF), which is based upon the current market value of the vehicle:

| Zero to \$4,999      | \$25                      |
| \$5,000 to \$24,999  | \$50                      |
| \$25,000 to \$34,999 | \$100                     |

Senate Bill (SB) 1 created the transportation improvement fee (TIF) under the State Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Program to provide additional resources for the state to repair infrastructure and for road maintenance. The TIF is a new variable fee that will be assessed as part of the total VR fee on specified vehicles. \$100 additional annual fee for zero-emissions vehicles in 2020.

The bill includes the largest gas tax increase in California's history — a \$5.2 billion annual tax increase that grows over time and never ends.
