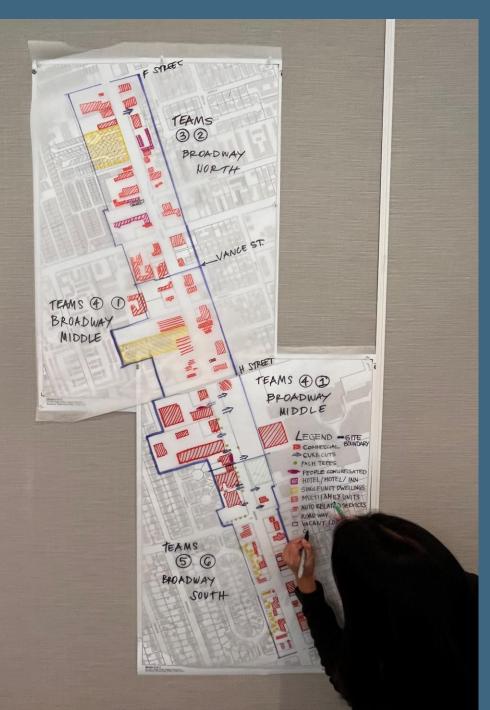

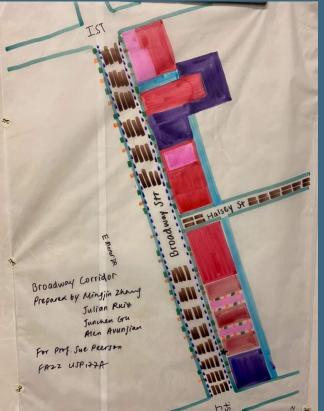

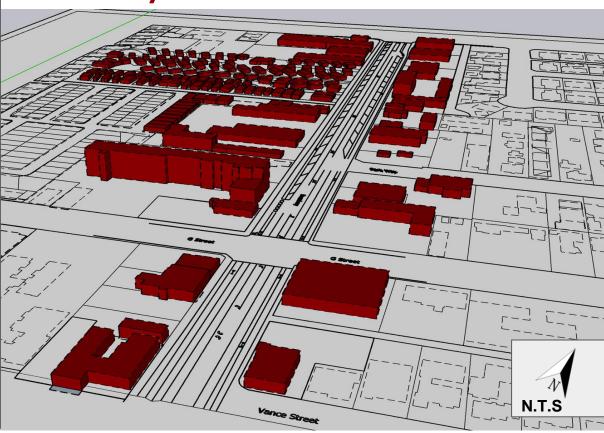

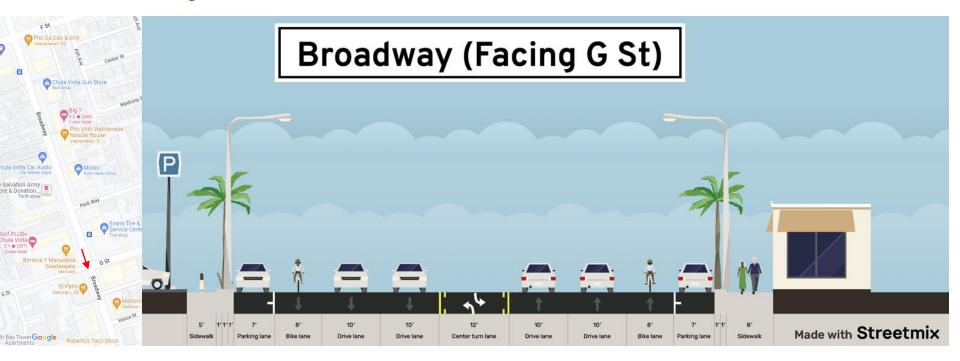

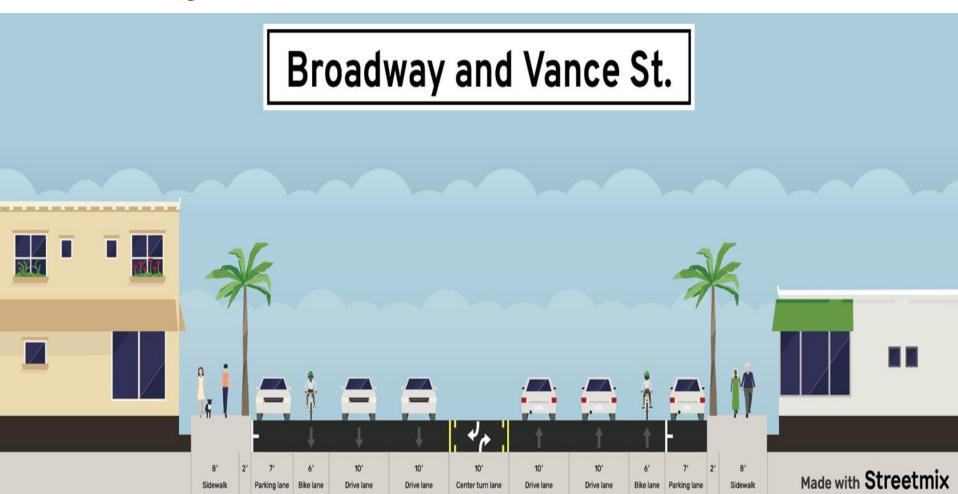

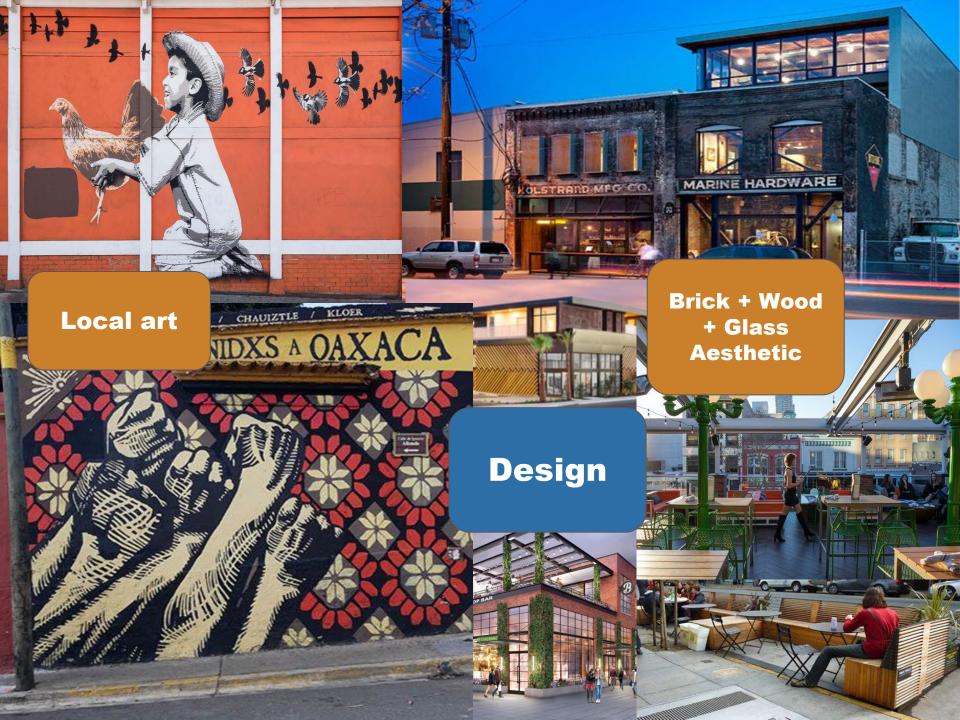

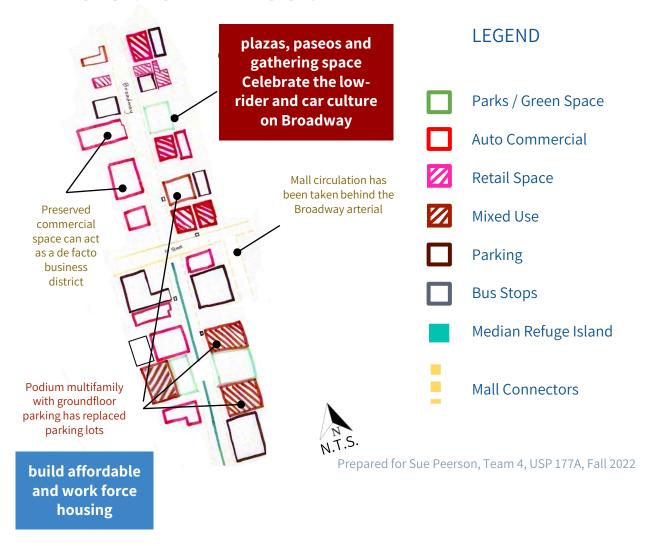

VISION

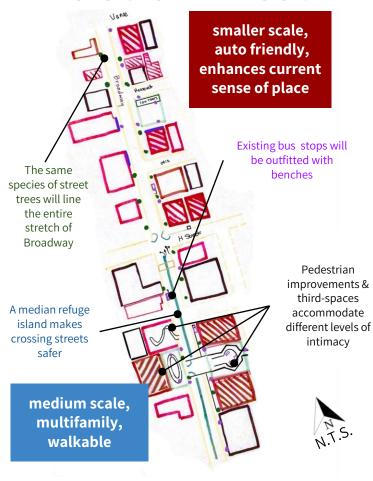
Peripheral commercial spaces and parking lots have been converted to vibrant, mixed use spaces.

This adds the density anticipated ahead of Chula Vista's Bayfront redevelopment.

Primary commercial uses (e.g., Firestone, Tacos El Gordo), circulation to retail, and parking have been maintained.

Visual continuity across the sections will be maintained with street trees and lighting.

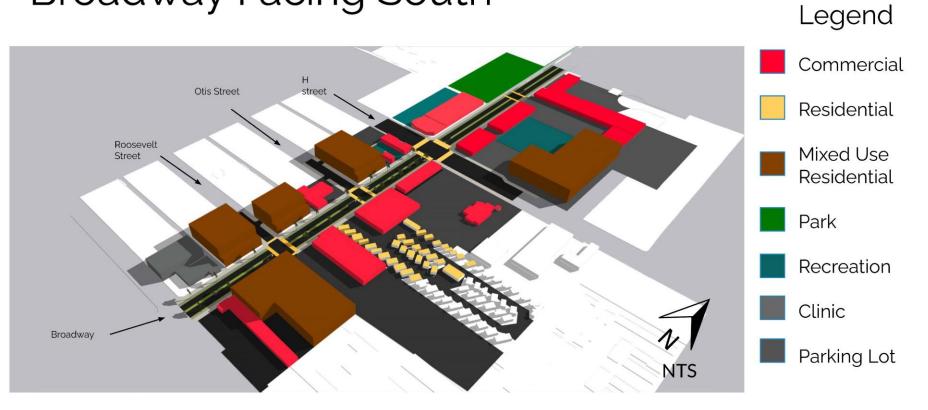
Pedestrian improvements create intentional wandering paths along three distinct uses and levels of intimacy:

- 2. Retail plaza to "eat and connect"
- 3. Park space to "be out and about"

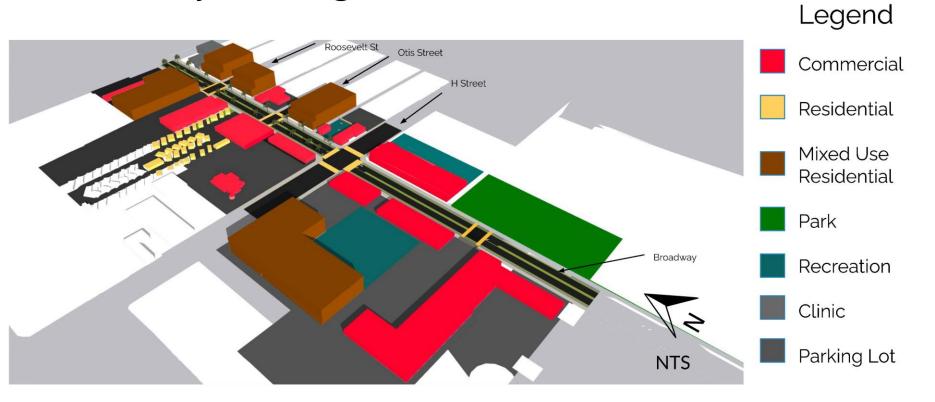

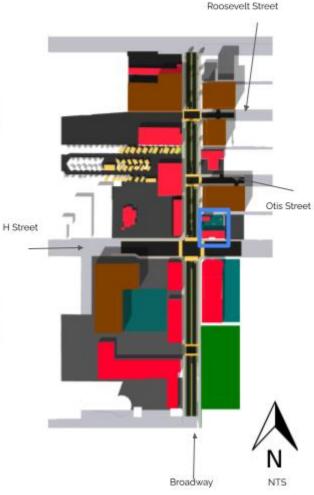
