PROJECTS & SERVICES TIER 1 – FALL 2023

Keep existing parks and recreation facilities safe, clean, and well-maintained

Fix potholes

Repair infrastructure including sidewalks, curbs, and storm drains

Pave and maintain local streets

Repair or replace aging underground stormwater pipes that are at risk of collapse and creating sinkholes

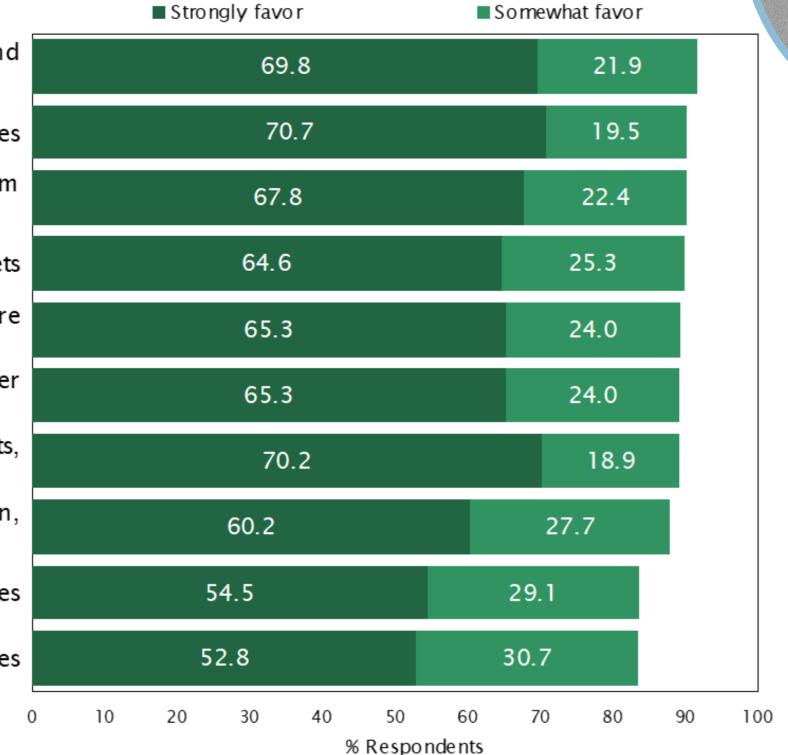
Make improvements to roads and intersections to better manage traffic congestion on city streets

Clean up piles of trash and litter that people dump along streets, sidewalks, and in public areas

Keep newer and recently repaired streets in good condition, before they become more costly to repair

Upgrade 911 emergency equipment and community facilities

Improve access for residents with special needs or disabilities



PROJECTS & SERVICES TIER 2 - FALL 2023

Address homelessness

Install sidewalks, where needed

Repair older community facilities including fixing roofs, plumbing, electrical, and structural problems

Upgrade recreation facilities and equipment so they meet current health and safety standards

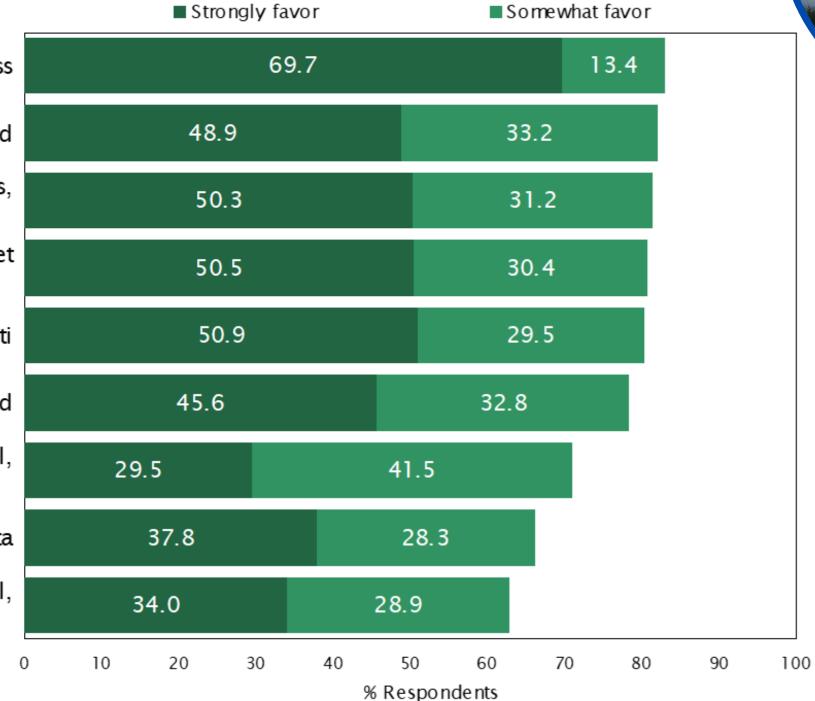
Remove graffiti

Create new multi-purpose sports fields for soccer, baseball, softball, and lacrosse

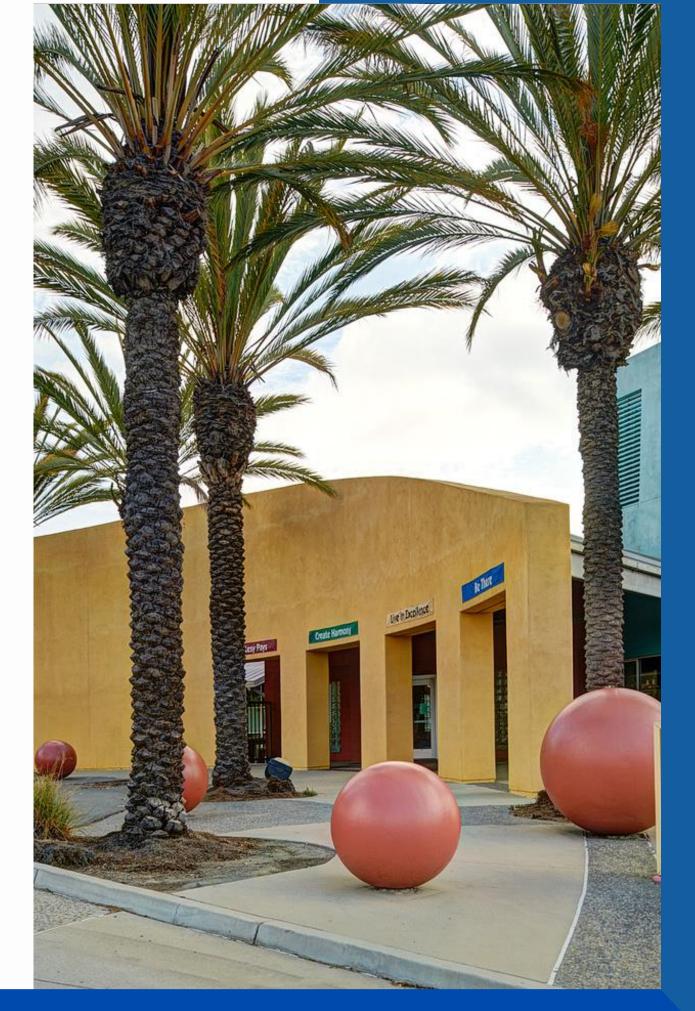

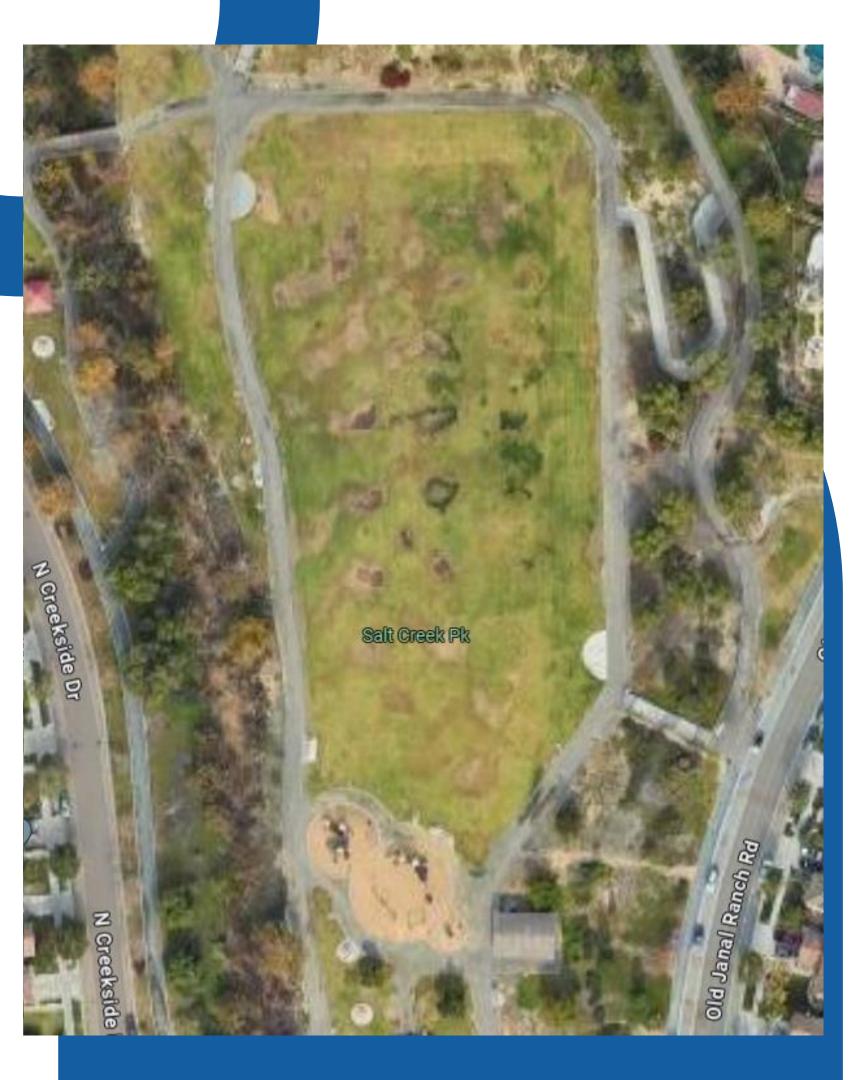

- Build into General Fund Long Term Financial Plan for FY 2037-38

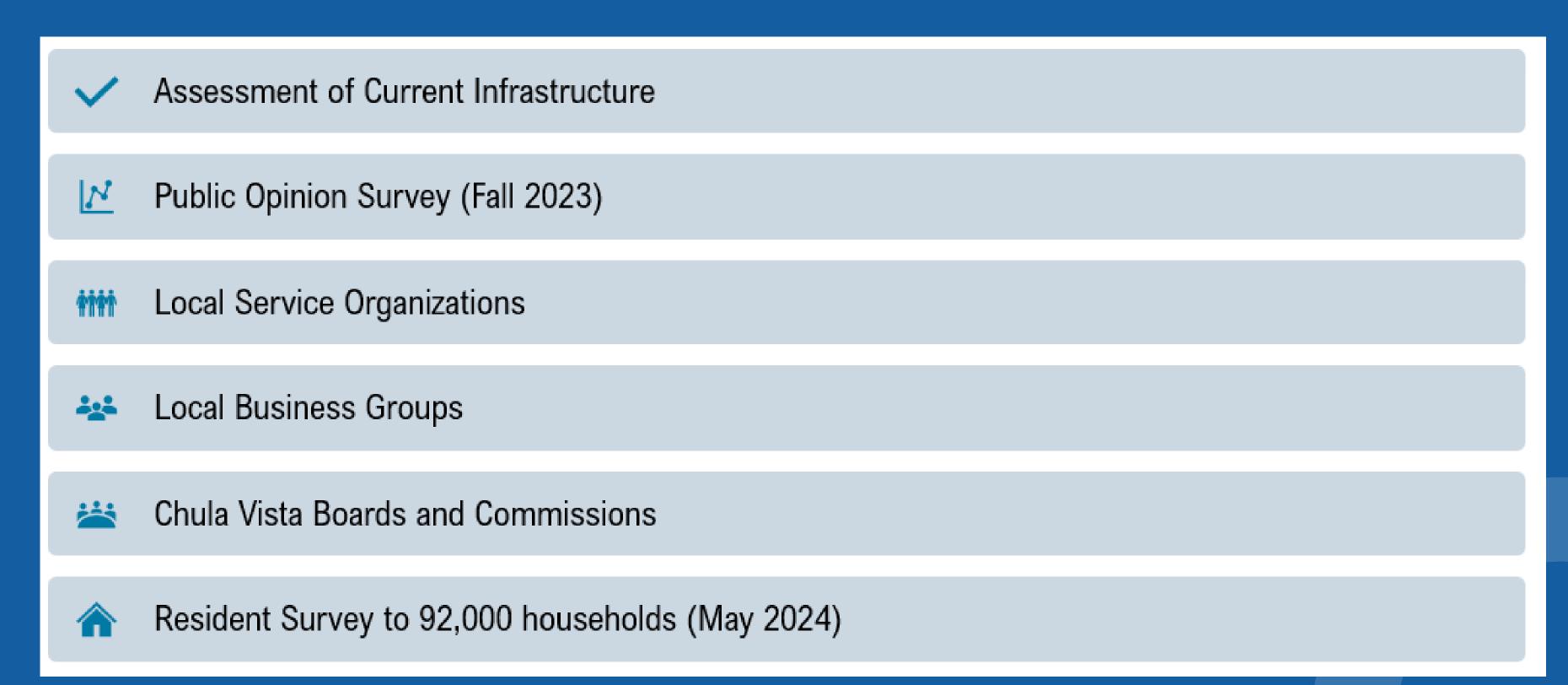
