

BORDER 2 FIRE









Summary of social media efforts

Beginning Thursday, January 23, at 3 p.m. the City of Chula Vista activated the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to respond to the Border 2 Fire on Otay Mountain. The Office of Communications, in collaboration with the Fire Department and Police Department, launched a coordinated effort to inform residents about the Border 2 Fire. Updates were shared across Facebook, Instagram, X, and the City website ensuring timely and accurate information reached the community.

A dedicated news update City webpage was launched by 4 p.m. to serve as the primary source for emergency information and provide one location for City information to be featured. A direct link was established at **chulavistaca.gov/border2fire** (link now deactivated) and was consistently featured on all social media posts. As new information from the EOC was available, the City news page was updated.

From **January 23 through January 28**, a total of **19 posts** were shared. All social media posts were provided in both *English and Spanish*, maximizing accessibility for residents. In addition to standard posts, updates were shared via stories to increase visibility and engagement. The content focused on providing real-time updates, safety information, and resources.

Posts were also amplified by other City social media accounts, including Parks and Recreation, Animal Services, Library, and Sustainability. Additionally, various elected officials, residents, and media outlets—such as Univision San Diego—helped extend the reach of critical information by sharing posts. The collaborative approach between departments ensured a consistent and reliable flow of information.

The following numbers indicate the sum of all (19) post engagements under each social media platform, providing a comprehensive view of overall audience interactions.

Based on social media metrics, Instagram had the largest viewership. **Post number 6 on Instagram** had the most significant impact, with:

Growth in followers

The widespread engagement also led to a noticeable increase in followers across City social media accounts. The @ThinkChulaVista accounts gained 1,500 new followers on Instagram, 3,343 on Facebook, and 200 on X during this period. Other departments also saw significant growth in their social media followings.

Understanding Platform-Specific Analytics

It is important to note that different social media platforms use unique metrics to track engagement and visibility:

- **Reach:** The number of unique users who saw a post, whether through organic distribution, paid promotion, or resharing. Reach is only counted once per user, even if they see the post multiple times.
- **Views:** The total number of times a video or post was displayed or played, regardless of whether it was seen by unique users.
- Impressions (X): The number of times a post was displayed on X (formerly Twitter), including multiple views by the same user.



Air Quality Update: Border 2 Fire The Border 2 Fire on Otay Mountain is impacting air quality in San Diego County. Smoke is blowing west this morning and depositing ash on the ground in some communities, affecting South Bay communities, but winds are expected to shift east and northeast this afternoon, impacting areas like Dulzura and Jamul. Fine particulate matter (PM2.5) levels may reach unhealthy levels near the fire. If you smell smoke, limit outdoor activity and stay indoors, especially if you're elderly, a child, or have respiratory or heart conditions.
